The authors of the Meskwaki texts include Jim Peters, Sam Peters, and Pearl Leaf; the other writers are unidentified. The stories include "War story;" "Princess;" "Toad and Rattlesnake;" "Suicide of <na na wa ki e a>;" "Suicide of <ke de wo ki ma wa>;" "Turtle's race;" "Turtle's fight;" "Two young brothers;" "Twenty on the warpath;" "Fall camping in the south (Whitemen scalped alive);" "Spirit' kills Mesquakies and is killed by Thunderers;" "Hunting party attacked by Comanches;" "Talking dog;" "War story;" "Death reported by cloud;" "Man and two women;" "Squeech Owl' and feet;" "Hell Diver and beads;" "Mesquakies attacked by thirty, two escape by transformations;" and "Black Hawk's War."
