Provenance

Gift to the Department of Anthropology from Mrs. Lispenard S. Crocker, 1961. It was collected in Japan in the 1930s. From July 31 to August 5, 1939, the map was part of an exhibit entitled "Around the World" that was held at the Historic Warner House, Portsmouth, New Hampshire. It was transferred from the artifactual collection to the National Anthropological Archives in October 1985.

Scope and Contents

The map features the architectural details and ground plans of the Tōshōgū, the shrine which was built in 1617 for the tomb of Ieyasu, the first Tokugawa shogun. Included are two portraits, one of the Ieyasu and the other of the third Tokugawa shogun, Iemitsu. There are also views of a procession scene of the Tōshōgū festival, falls, shrines, and other items.
