Scope and Contents

The collection consists of a partially woven paper painting glued to a piece of cardboard. The painting depicts a bird and two orange and red fruits on a vine. Part of the painting is whole but has been marked to be cut into vertical strips. Some strips are cut but not yet woven, and other cut strips have been woven together with plain horizontal strips of paper. The painting is possibly a demonstration of the process of making a woven painting.

Please note that the contents of the collection and the language and terminology used reflect the context and culture of the time of its creation. As an historical document, its contents may be at odds with contemporary views and terminology and considered offensive today. The information within this collection does not reflect

the views of the Smithsonian Institution or National Anthropological Archives, but is available in its original form to facilitate research.
