Biographical / Historical

During World War II, most of the US Army Air Forces' combat units were assigned to numbered air forces. The Fifteenth Air Force, activated in the Mediterranean theater of operations on November 1, 1943, under the command of Major General James H. "Jimmy" Doolittle, was primarily engaged in strategic bombarding of targets in Italy, France, Germany, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Austria, Hungary, and the Balkans. In January 1944, Doolittle was assigned command of the Eighth Air Force in England, relinquishing command of the Fifteenth Air Force (15AF), based in Bari, Italy, to Major General Nathan F. Twining (1897--1982). In addition to his duties as commander of 15AF, Twining soon became head of the Mediterranean Allied Strategic Air Forces. Major Dean Burdette Yount, born in Tonkawa, Oklahoma, in 1910, served as an aide to General Twining throughout the war. Yount, later promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, was a relative of Lt. General Barton K. Yount, wartime head of the US Army Air Forces Training Command. General Twining served as Commander in Chief of the Alaskan Air Command from October 1947 to July 1950.

Scope and Contents

This collection consists of two small photo albums created by the 1st Combat Camera Unit, US Army Air Forces, probably for Major General Nathan F. Twining, Commanding General Fifteenth Air Force, and his staff: one relates to General Henry H. "Hap" Arnold's visit to Fifteenth Air Force commanders in central Italy in April 1945 (30 pages); the other is a memory book possibly created as a present for Twining circa June 1945 at the conclusion of his command of the Fifteenth Air Force (75 pages). Also included is a portrait photograph by Fabian Bachrach of Major Dean B. Yount, Aide to General Twining, and a certificate for crossing the Arctic Circle issued to Yount in May 1950.

Twining at the conclusion of his command of 15AF circa June 1945, produced by 1st Combat Camera Unit, US Army Air Forces. Inside front cover is a composite photograph featuring 15AF insignia at center surrounded by aircraft flown by 15AF units: North American P-51 Mustang, Consolidated B-24 Liberator, Lockheed P-38 Lightning, Boeing B-17 Flying Fortress. Views include USAAF and foreign senior officers and men, with a large section of photographs taken at a banquet dinner event featuring 15AF personnel; USAAF officers inspecting Italian troops; Women's Air Corps (WAC) personnel and nurses; routine base life (fumigating clothing, visit from "Santa Claus," open air religious service); captured German aircraft; aircraft nose art; bomb damage including firefighting and providing aid to injured Italian civilians; USAAF personnel receiving medals; and wreath laying at an American cemetery in Italy. Of note are a view of General Ira C. Eaker, Commander-in-Chief of the Mediterranean Allied Air Forces, looking through a small photo album in the same type of thick clear acrylic plastic binding as this one; and a full-length view of Major Dean B. Yount speaking at a microphone.

Certificate for crossing the Arctic Circle issued to Major Dean B. Yount, for crossing on 4 May 1950; signed by Lt. General Nathan F. Twining, Commander-in-Chief, Alaska (US Air Force Alaskan Air Command). Hand-colored black and white illustration includes a pictorial map of the state of Alaska featuring small illustrations of local wildlife (bear, moose, seal, whale), sights (kayak, dog sled, totem poles, man panning for gold), a Boeing-B-17 type aircraft in flight, a rising or setting sun, and a fanciful striped "North Pole" at top center.
