## **Biographical / Historical**

Burroughs Wellcome and Company was founded in London, England, in 1880 by the American pharmacists Henry Wellcome and Silas Burroughs. The company's "Tabloid" line of compact first-aid medical kits housed in lightweight aluminum cases were marketed to aviators as early as 1909. In the 1920s, Burroughs Wellcome established research and manufacturing facilities in the United States; "Tabloid" medical kits were carried aboard the Douglas World Cruiser airplanes during the 1924 US Army Around the World Flight as well as by the Byrd Arctic Expedition of 1926. In 1995 the company merged with Glaxo to form Glaxo Wellcome; by the early 2020s the company was part of GlaxoSmithKline (GSK), a multinational pharmaceutical and biotechnology company.

### **Scope and Contents**

This collection is believed to consist of eight black and white photographs received by the National Air Museum in 1930 relating to the Burroughs Wellcome & Company "Tabloid" brand of medical kits (as of 2025 only six of the eight photographs have been identified in the Archives' holdings). One photograph depicts the kit carried by the Byrd Arctic Expedition of 1926; the remaining photographs show kits related to the 1924 US Army Around the World Flight. Views include a kit used on the flight, a presentation kit, and several of the Douglas World Cruiser airmen posing during the world flight holding a "Tabloid" kit.
