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## Administrative Information

### Acquisition Information

Children is a portion of the Business Ephemera Series of the Warshaw Collection of Business Americana, Accession AC0060 purchased from Isadore Warshaw in 1967. Warshaw continued to accumulate similar material until his death, which was donated in 1971 by his widow, Augusta. For a period after acquisition, related materials from other sources (of mixed provenance) were added to the collection so there may be content produced or published after Warshaw's death in 1969. This practice has since ceased.

## Processing Information

In 2016, with funding provided by the Smithsonian Institution's Collections Care and Preservation Fund, the Archives Center at the National Museum of American History implemented the use of minimal level processing standards to increase information about and facilitate access to more of our collections. A large portion of stored material from the original acquisition received minimal level processing, which resulted in additions to this Subject category. This effort included basic arrangement and replacement of non-archival housing for long-term stability, but staples and other fasteners have not all been removed. Revisions to the encoded finding aid were made to reflect the added content in context to the previously processed material.

There are many small sized children's books from the late 19th century including fairy tales, nursery rhymes, and moral tales as well as some books meant for use in school, such as primers. This series also includes some periodicals for children and catalogs for ordering books for children. Lastly, the series includes books and other published materials for use in a child's religious education.

## Subseries 2: Images of Children, 1874-1930

Scope and Contents: This subseries contains eighteen folders of images of children that are divided into different subjects according to what the images depict. The images include prints, engravings, color and black and white images, and a few photographs. Some of the subjects that the images depict are children with animals, children playing, children sleeping, and children praying. The bulk of the images in this series are undated, but most are from the late nineteenth century. There is an oversized image of two girls found in the oversized collection.

### Subseries 3: Miscellaneous Materials Relating to Children, 1883-1931

**Scope and Contents:** This subseries is divided into four sections. The first section deals with advice for raising children and contains mostly booklets for helping new mothers. The second section contains baby books for recording a child's progression through infancy. None of these books have been written in. The third section contains tiny cards with envelopes used as birth announcements during the late 19th century. Each card has the name of a child printed on it. The last section of miscellaneous materials relating to children includes materials on children's rights. These materials include typed and handwritten letters and booklets on the prevention of cruelty to children.

**Scope and Contents:** This subseries includes advertisements, business cards, catalogs, and invoices for businesses that produce goods for children. The first half of the series contains children's clothing businesses and the second half contains children's furniture businesses. The section on children's furniture also includes rocking horses, carriages, and wagons. The bulk of this series is from the late nineteenth century. In addition to these materials, there are two advertisements for children's furniture found in the oversized collection.
