Summary: A New York bookseller, Warshaw assembled this collection over nearly

Lathes is a portion of the Business Ephemera Series of the Warshaw Collection of Business Americana, Accession AC0060 purchased from Isadore Warshaw in 1967. Warshaw continued to accumulate similar material until his death, which was donated in 1971 by his widow, Augusta. For a period after acquisition, related materials from other sources (of mixed provenance) were added to the collection so there may be content produced or published after Warshaw's death in 1969. This practice has since ceased.

Scope and Contents:

Subseries one consists of materials from companies that manufactured various lathes. Items include advertising sheets, informational brochures, business cards, correspondence primarily involving product information and pricing, price lists, catalogues that are mostly illustrated, receipts, and operating handbooks. The bulk of the materials are from the late 19th century. There is a wide variety of locations, mostly in the northeastern United States, including New York, Illinois, Michigan, Philadelphia, Wisconsin, Indiana, Ohio, New Hampshire and several different cities in Massachusetts and Connecticut. There is also one company located in Manchester, England.
