He believes he made the tape sometime between 1947 and 1949. According to secondary sources Ellington was in Kansas in November 1946, October 1947, and January and February 1948. No documents in the Duke Ellington Collection corroborate this information or refer to the Wichita performance.  
  
The sound quality is fair, with ambient background sounds of the crowd. The lead vocalists were Al Hibbler and Kay Davis.
