Biographical / Historical

Peter Matthew Marks was born February 21, 1843 to parents William Augustus Marks and Anne Mooney (Marks) in Ireland. He grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio learning to play piano, harp, and guitar. Marks performed with various minstrel troupes in and around Cincinnati, Ohio. During the war, he served as a member of the Ohio militia for one month before leaving to continue his music career. Peter Marks met and married Mary "Emma" McKitrick. He ultimately left the minstrel circuit and went on to become a professor at the Cincinnati College of Music. He died in 1883.

Scope and Contents

The collection contains the personal and professional papers of musician Peter Marks dating primarily from the mid to late nineteenth century. These materials provide valuable insight into life before and after the Civil War mainly through correspondence and other primary sources documenting domestic activities. The materials also document how a musician was able to make a living teaching music and performing in classical music concerts, as well as, with minstrel troupes.

Scope and Contents:

Consists of the personal papers of Peter Marks including school books, correspondence, agreements, magazine articles, enlistment papers, photographs, receipts, poetry, business card, sign and advertisements for private music lessons, and a burial plot certificate. There are a few materials relating to Mark's wife Mary "Emma" McKitrick primarily her correspondence with Burlingame relatives on her mother's side of the family. In addition, there are music and school books that belonged to his son Eugene. Marks's mother Anne Mooney Marks has a small amount of material including photographs, poetry, letters and a burial plot certificate. There is relativly no information relating to his father William Augustus Marks or his son Ralph. The materials are arranged in chronological order.

Series 2: Professional Materials, 1849-1915; undated

Scope and Contents:

Materials provide a glimpse into minstrelsy as a popular nineteeth century American form of entertainment. These promotional materials were created or used by Peter Marks over the course of his music career. The series is divided into three subseries. Subseries 2.1 is playbills, programs, posters and advertisements dating from 1863-1879 with some undated material. Subseries 2.2 consists of sheet music dating primarily from 1843-1901. Subseries 2.3 contains publications dating from 1849-1915.

Subseries 2.1: Playbills, Programs, Posters, and Advertisements, 1863-1879; undated

Scope and Contents:

Materials document the career of harpist Peter Marks as he performed for various minstrel troupes in the mid-1800s primarily through newspaper, placards, and promotional materials. These materials were created by the various troupes that Marks performed with and are arranged in alphabetical order by the name of the toupe.
