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## Biographical / Historical

Largely from the 1950s, these menus are evidence of American imagery, food prices, and food culture.

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## Scope and Contents

A collection of restaurant menus from 1937 to 1999, but with the majority from the 1950s. While a large number are from California, especially the Los Angeles area, the menus come from twenty U.S. states, plus the Virgin Islands, Canada, and a few are from cruise ships. The menus tend to be picturesque or have colorful illustrations. Cowboy and western themes are emphasized and some of the menus are in novel or odd shapes. Some menus from famous restaurants are included such as Palmer House in Chicago, Old Original Bookbinders in Philadelphia, and Tavern on the Green in New York.

Collection is arranged alphabetically by restaurant name into file comprising 1 series.
