Biographical / Historical

The Boston Elevated Railway Company built tracking and supports for elevated railway cars in Boston between 1899 and 1901. These railways were created to connect suburbs to central Boston. The tracking was combined with the new subway system, creating new routes for transportation for 20th century Boston.

Content Description

Collection consists of cyanotype photographs documenting the construction of the Boston Elevated Railway, Boston, Massachusetts circa 1899-1901. There are photographs of the Charleston Bridge in progress, equipment in use, workers, and Boston street views. Specifically, there are images of the Wheelwright building, the Waverly house, Sullivan Square, the Lincoln Wharf Power Station, Sullivan Square Station, Dewey Square, Lincoln Power Station, and North Station. The album also includes group photographs of workers. Included in the album is a short undated newspaper clipping about the company.
