Biographical / Historical

Joseph Trueman Thompson, a civil engineer, was born March 28, 1891, in Baltimore, Maryland to Joseph Camillus Thompson Sr. (6 March 1861 - 12 January 1943) and Francis E. Slingluff (March 1870 - unknown). He graduated from Baltimore City College in 1910 and attended Johns Hopkins University where he completed his studies in 1917. Thompson married Sarah Madison Brockenbrough on July 7, 1917, and to the union one daughter, Elizabeth Madison Thompson (17 August 1922 - 3 September 1995), was born. He served as an officer in the Army Corps of Engineers before joining the faculty of Johns Hopkins University's Civil Engineering Department in 1919. During his tenure with the university, he also worked with the United States Government serving as a War Department adviser and chairman of the National Highway Traffic Advisory Committee. Thompson retired from Johns Hopkins University in 1958 but continued to do research on highways, a field he had become regarded as an expert and had written numerous publications on. He died in 1977 in Baltimore, Maryland at the age of eighty-five.

Content Description

Papers primarily consisting of black and white photographs documenting highway impact tests and impact tests on beam and bridge members. In addition, there is a list of Thompson's publications and two copies of *Public Roads*, a journal of highway research published by the United States Department of Agriculture, dating from 1924 and 1928.
