# **Biographical**

Fay L. Faurote was director of public relations for the Society of Automotive Engineers and was well known in the field of advertising and automobile manufacturing.

### **Historical**

Peter Heldt of *The Horseless Age*, and Horace Swetland of The *Automobile*, formed the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) circa 1902 in New York City which published a technical journal and a comprehensive compilation of technical papers, previously called *SAE Transactions*, which still exist today in the form of SAE International's Journals. Today the society represents engineers in all types of mobility-related professions.

# **Content Description**

Collection of materials from the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE), primarily photographs and programs from SAE trade shows, along with a roster of members, a handbook, and publications celebrating the SAE's 30th anniversary.
