Summary:	The Mary Harriman Rumsey collection largely consists of photographic prints and lantern slides documenting the Harriman Expedition to Alaska in summer 1899. These depict members of the expedition and Alaskan scenery and people. The collection also includes scenic photographs of Alaska taken by Dora Keen in 1914 and photographs of Blackfeet, Hopi, Apache, and Suquamish Indians made by Edward Curtis in 1900 and 1903.

This collection was donated as part of the estate of Mary Harriman Rumsey to the Museum of the American Indian, Heye Foundation, in May 1934.

Provenance

Photographs of the Harriman Alaska Expedition may have originally been collected by Edward Henry Harriman.

Biographical / Historical

Mary Harriman Rumsey (1881-1934) was an important American philanthropist and the oldest child of railroad tycoon Edward Henry Harriman. In 1901, while studying at Barnard College, she co-founded the Junior League for the Promotion of Settlement Movements (later named the Junior League of the City of New York), which facilitated charitable work by privileged women among New York's impoverished groups. Rumsey's efforts lead to the establishment of the Association of Junior Leagues International Inc. in 1921. Additionally, Rumsey co-founded *Today* magazine with her brother Averell Harriman and others, and in 1933 she chaired the Consumer Advisory Board of the National Recovery Administration.

In 1899, Mary Harriman was among the Harriman family members who accompanied the Harriman Alaska Expedition. Originally planned as a bear-hunting trip for the family, the expedition, was funded by Edward Henry Harriman and organized with the help of ethnographer and naturalist Clinton Hart Merriam. The party of accomplished scientists, naturalists, photographers, artists, and writers cruised from British Columbia to Siberia and back on a private ship, the *SS George W. Elder*, in June and July of 1899. The scientists' findings were published in the thirteen-volume *Harriman Alaska Series*, and Harriman also paid the expedition's official photographer, Edward S. Curtis, to compile souvenir albums from the over 5,000 photographs made during the course of the expedition.

Scope and Contents

The bulk of the collection comprises photographic prints, lantern slides, and one map documenting the Harriman Alaska Expedition from May to July of 1899. These photographs were made by members of the expedition, most prominently its official photographer Edward S. Curtis, funder Edward Henry Harriman, and lead scientist C. Hart Merriam. They depict Alaskan scenery, members of the expedition, and Native people and settlements that they encountered. Mary Harriman Rumsey's collection also includes later platinum prints of American Indians made and signed by Curtis (1900, 1903), photographs of glaciers in Alaska by Dora Keen (1914), a photograph of a painting by Charles Schreyvogel (1903), and a photograph of White Pass by Arthur Clarence Pillsbury (1898).

Arrangement

The collection is arranged in three series: photographs relating to the Harriman Expedition; photographs of Alaska that were not made on the Harriman Expedition; and other photographs relating to American Indians. The Harriman series is arranged in a rough chronological order.

Chronology: This series contains photographs made from May 31 to July 30, 1899, during the Harriman Alaska Expedition. Photographers represented in the series are Edward S. Curtis (official photographer for the expedition), Edward Henry Harriman, C. Hart Merriam, W. B. Devereux, William H. Averell, Wesley Coe, Leon J. Cole, Grove Karl Gilbert, and Robert Ridgway; some photographs also may have been made by Curtis's assistant for the voyage, D. J. Inverarity. There is also a map documenting the passage of the expedition's ship, the SS *George W. Elder*.

Most of the prints were likely removed from one of the expedition's souvenir albums, or at least were made in preparation for the albums, and they are duplicated in the lantern slides. Many of the lantern slides represent unique images and many are hand-colored.

The following is a rough chronology of the expedition, based on PBS's *Harriman Expedition Retraced* (<http://www.pbs.org/harriman/1899/chronology.html>):

<i>May 23</i>	Harriman's private train leaves New York City with many of the scientists on board
<i>May 31</i>	The train arrives in Seattle, where the remainder of the expedition party joins them on the SS <i>George W. Elder</i>
<i>June 2</i>	The expedition stops at Vancouver Island before traveling north along the British Columbia coast
<i>June 3</i>	Stop at Lowe Inlet to allow a group of scientists to explore Princess Royal Island
<i>June 4</i>	Stop at Metlakatla
<i>June 5</i>	Stop at Wrangell
<i>June 6</i>	Stop at Treadwell Mine near Skagway; 5 scientists stay for several days
<i>June 7</i>	Stop to ride White Pass Railroad
<i>June 8</i>	Stop at Juneau to pick up scientists left at Lowe Inlet and then head to Glacier Bay
<i>June 15-18</i>	Stop at Sitka
<i>June 9-14</i>	Cruise Glacier Bay, including exploration of Muir Glacier, other glaciers and a 12-man hike to Howling Glacier
<i>June 19</i>	Stop at Yakutat mission settlement
<i>June 20-23</i>	Cruise to map Malaspina Glacier, observe seal hunters, and explore Disenchantment Bay

<i>June 24</i>	Stop at salmon cannery at Orca; converse with rush miners
<i>June 25-29</i>	Cruise Prince William Sound and discover and Harriman Fiord and Harriman Glacier on June 2
<i>June 30</i>	Originally headed to Cook Inlet, but instead head Kodiak Island to hunt bear
<i>July 1-4</i>	Bear hunting and July 4th celebration in Kodiak town (with boat races); Dellenbaugh hears about uninhabited Tlingit village in south Alaska
<i>July 5-6</i>	Pass Shumagin Islands on way to Bering Sea
<i>July 7</i>	Five scientists set up camp on Popof Island as <i>Elder</i> heads onward
<i>July 8</i>	Stop at Dutch Harbor, Unalaska, and at Bogoslof before heading into the Bering Sea
<i>July 9</i>	Stop at St. Paul Island in the Pribilofs
<i>July 10</i>	Travel through Bering Sea toward Siberia
<i>July 11</i>	Stop at Plover Bay, Siberia, to visit Eskimo settlement
<i>July 12</i>	Stop at Port Clarence
<i>July 13</i>	Stop at St. Lawrence Island
<i>July 14</i>	Stop at Hall Island
<i>July 15</i>	Stop at St. Matthew Island
<i>July 16-19</i>	The <i>Elder</i> returns south, stopping at the Shumagin to retrieve camping scientists
<i>July 20</i>	Return to Kodiak
<i>July 21-25</i>	Returning south, stop at Juneau
<i>July 26-27</i>	Stop at uninhabited Tlingit village near Cape Fox
<i>July 30</i>	Arrive in Seattle
