Summary: The Septima Koehler collection includes photographic prints, correspondence

and student papers that document Septima's work as a mission teacher for the Episcopal Church in South Dakota from around 1895 to 1905. Koehler taught Sicangu Lakota students at St. Mary's Mission School on the Rosebud

Reservation and Hunkpapa Lakota students at St. Elizatbeth's Mission

School on the Standing Rock Reservation.

Some of the documents in Subseries 2.2: St. Elizabeth's Mission School: Documents, had been misfiled in the Museum of the American Indian, Heye Foundation records (NMAI.AC.001) under the name "Margaret R. Elliott." These were previously housed in Box 214, Folders 5-8, 11-12.

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Biographical / Historical

Septima Koehler (1848-1918) was one of seven children born to Herman and Aurore Koehler in Indiana. Both Septima and her sister Aurora worked as schoolteachers in southeasters Indiana from 1867 to about 1890 when the sisters began their mission work for the Episcopal Church. Around 1895 Septima was appointed by Bishop William Hobart Hare to teach at St. Mary's Mission School on the Rosebud Reservation while Aurora took a job as a librarian in Aberdeen, South Dakota. Only a few years later, around 1899, she was appointed to St. Elizabeth's mission school on the Standing Rock reservation where she taught under Principal Mary E. Francis. In addition to her teaching duties, Koehler also lectured on the importance of health and hygiene at reservation boarding schools, participating in the 1903 Standing Rock Institute organizing by A.O. Wright, supervisor of Indian Schools for the department of the Interior.

Between 1906 and 1908, the Koehler sisters moved to Nashville Tennessee to work within the African American community and from 1908-1909 they worked in a mill in LaGrange, Georgia. Septima died in Hagerstown, Maryland in 1918 from pneumonia.

Scope and Contents

The Septima Koehler collection includes photographic prints, letters, essays and student papers that document Septima's work as a mission teacher for the Episcopal Church in South Dakota from around 1895 to 1905. The collection has been divided into two series, Series 1: St. Mary's Mission School, circa 1895 and Series 2: St. Elizabeth's Mission School, circa 1899-1905. Series 1 includes photographic prints shot at St. Mary's Mission School on the Rosebud Reservation, South Dakota. Septima Koehler taught there in the early to mid-1890s but it is unclear when the photographs were taken since the photographer is unknown. The majority of the photographs in the collection were shot at St. Elizabeth's Mission School in Wakpala on the Standing Rock Reservation, South Dakota which are a part of Series 2. These were taken between 1899 and 1902 and several include shots of Septima Koehler herself which suggest they were shot by someone who knew her. There are also a number of portraits of Lakota students who attended the school, some identified with names on the backs of the photographs, including members of the Deloria family among others. There is also a group portrait from the 1903 teacher institute held at Standing Rock organized by A.O. Wright, Supervisor of Indian Schools. In addition to the photographs, there are essays and lesson plans written by Koehler, a letter from Septima Koehler to her sister Aurora from 1902 describing the start of the school year and student papers and work sheets produced by the Native American students (mostly

Hunkpapa Lakota) attending the school as well as a student roll book. There are also name and receipt books from Koehler's work with the "Babies' Branch", a missionary outfit that raised money specifically for children.

The majority of the photographic prints in this collection are silver gelatin and most of the St. Elizabeth's photographs are both circular and matted. The prints have catalog numbers P19485-P19523.

Scope and Contents:

The St. Mary's Mission school was opened in 1885 by the Episcopal Church, under the direction of Reverend W.J. Cleveland. It was originally built as a boarding school to accommodate between 50 and 60 Lakota students from the Rosebud Reservation and was located 12 miles northeast of the Rosebud Agency. The boarding school housed both boys and girls. Septima Koehler was appointed by Bishop William Hobart Hare around 1895 as a teacher at the school. There are four photographic prints in this series shot at St. Mary's depicting the school building and posed students in a classroom. These were likely part of a series, "St. Mary's Mission S.D" by an unknown photographer and have the numbers "48" to "50".

Biographical / Historical:

The construction of St. Elizabeth's Mission, the first Episcopal mission on the Standing Rock Reservation, began in 1885 near Wakpala, South Dakota under the watch of Bishop William Hobart Hare. Reverend Philip J. Deloria (Dakota), originally from the Yankton band of Dakota, moved to Standing Rock once he was ordained, to take over the running of the mission and ministered the congregation at St. Elizabeth's until 1925. An enlarged boarding school opened in the fall of 1890 with Mary E. Francis appointed as Principal. Septima Koehler was appointed to St. Elizabeth's sometime around 1899, transferring from St. Mary's on the Rosebud Reservation. Koehler taught at St. Elizabeth's through 1905, teaching Native American students of all ages and taking a special interest in student health. In the fall of 1902 around 60 students, boys and girls, mainly Lakota children from the Standing Rock reservation, were enrolled at the school. This included several of Philip Deloria's children.

Scope and Contents:

This series includes 35 photographic prints taken in and around St. Elizabeth's mission in Wakpala, South Dakota on the Standing Rock Reservation as well as correspondence and school papers. Photographs taken at the school include images of students in classrooms, drying dishes in the kitchens, and posed out front of the school. Identified students include: Alma Swiftcloud, Maude Boneclub, Josephine Hailhawk, Louise Lowdog, Minnie Deloria, Frank Howard, Philip U. Deloria, Abraham and George Shave elk. Staff and visitors photographed at the school include: Reverend Philip J. Deloria, Dr. Charles Eastman (Dakota), Reverend Herbert Welsh, Bishop William Hobart Hare, and Septima Koehler. There are also several photographs of Septima Koehler among Hunkpapa Lakota community members at their camp in Wakpala. Also included is a group portrait from the 1903 teacher institute held at Standing Rock organized by A.O. Wright, Supervisor of Indian Schools.

In addition to the photographs there are several folders of school papers written by Koehler's students from primer class up to fourth reader class between 1899 and 1901 All of the names of the students are recorded in the scope note of their folder. There is a letter from Septima to her sister Aurora from September 1902 which describes the start of the fall term as well as a letter from former student Jane Kills Enemy to principal Mary Francis. There are several essays and lesson plans written by Koehler as well as name and receipt books from Koehler's work with the "Babies' Branch", a missionary outfit that raised money specifically for children.
