Biographical / Historical

Richard Erdoes (1912-2008) was born in Frankfurt, Germany. He studied art in Berlin and published anti-Nazi cartoons. After fleeing Germany, he continued his art studies in Vienna and Paris before moving to New York City. He created cartoons for many magazines including the New York Times and Harper's Bazaar and illustrated children's books. Erdoes became interested in Native American culture after visiting the Pine Ridge Reservation on an assignment for Life magazine. The people he met and conditions on the reservation had a big impact on Erdoes, encouraging him to become an active supporter of indigenous civil rights. He wrote and edited multiple books on American Indian life and culture.

Scope and Contents

Collection contains 26 color photographs (10 oversized) and 248 color slides made by Richard Erdoes in Arizona, New Mexico, South Dakota, and Mexico from 1969-1980. Images depict pottery, landscapes, daily life, sweat lodges, and ceremonies. The identified ceremonies are Cloud Dance, Deer Dance, Ghost Dance, Yuwipi Ceremony, Sun Dance, Corn Dance, Zuni Eagle Dance, and Mattachine Dance.

Some of the images have been restricted due to cultural sensitivity.
